STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM  
 Date: 2006-06-13  
 Time: 10:00 A.M.

Present: Corporal Tracy KENNETT  
 RCMP Major Crimes Unit  
 Ken GRAHAM

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KENNETT: [noise/talking in background]  
 Just have a seat and I'll be right back.

GRAHAM: Okay, thanks  
 [door closes]

KENNETT: Today's the 13<sup>th</sup> of June, 2006. Corporal Tracy KENNETT here  
 with Ken GRAHAM. And Ken here's a co., and the time is 10:00.  
 Ahm, there's a copy of your notes.

GRAHAM: Okay.

KENNETT: That, just take your time right now and ah, refresh your memory.  
 This is with regards to a fatal MVC that occurred on February the  
 25, 2005.

GRAHAM: (paper rustling) Okay.

KENNETT: Do you recall now after looking at your notes, do you recall the, the  
 accident?

GRAHAM: Yes I re..., recall the accident. Ahm, approximately 10 after 7 that  
 morning, I received a call from (cu) that there was a three vehicle  
 accident at the intersection of 59 and the Perimeter...

KENNETT: Right.

GRAHAM: ...ahm, southbound lanes. So ah, myself and ah, Chief BAKEMA  
 attended one vehicle. Ahm, Corporal WOYCHUK I believe  
 attended another vehicle and also Glenda PEDERSON was also  
 working. I'm sure also attended. Ahm, Chief Bakema and I were  
 the first ones of us to arrive there. Ahm, Winnipeg Fire Paramedic  
 were already there on the scene. Amh, did have one vehicle. As we  
 arrived, (cu)saw a green car off to the side, hit a snow bank on the  
 right side of the road. Ahm, that just cleared the light standard.  
 There's another vehicle it was a yellow Sprint, sitting in the middle  
 of 59, that was facing east - west, and severe damage to the rear

of it. Ahm, there was a convertible the top is, was off and everything. Ahm, and the third vehicle was I think it was a black or green ah, Dodge Dakota. Was further ahead south of 59, ahm, in the ditch in the medium ditch. Ahm, at that time ahm, I stopped traffic trying to re-route them out of the way. Chief BAKEMA ahm, went forward he walked up to the vehicles. Ahm, and then I waited for Glen PEDERSEN. She came and started to re-route traffic, so I went in to give them a hand at the scene. Ahm, at that time the East St. Paul ahm, First Responders attended. They attended to the yellow Sprint, that was in the middle of 59. Ahm, they came back to me advised that there were no signs of life of the female, the lone female of the vehicle. She's the driver. Ahm, then at that time, I believe Constable WOYCHUK arrived. Ahm, Chief BAKEMA went, I saw him walking to the third vehicle, which was the truck further ahead. And ahm, I think he put, I saw him put that driver of that vehicle or whoever was there in the ah, vehicle that Constable WOYCHUK had at the time. Ahm, after that ahm, (pause) basically assisted in ah, in directing traffic. Ahm, I went to the Dodge truck. I opened it up and I could smell a strong odor of alcohol inside the, inside the vehicle. Ahm, I then noticed that there was a Police uniform a pair of pants and shirt in the vehicle, which I then put in a bag and seized it at that time. And ah, which was later taken back to the office. Ahm,(pause) The daughter of the deceased ahm, saw her mom's vehicle, which was the yellow Sprint in the middle of the road, and she terrified she saw that, she came round and I had to stop for you know(cu)ahm, then the family came down and ahm, they took the deceased to the hospital. I believe it was Concordia and ahm, directed the family to do where to go, help with traffic again. RCMP analyst came out. I believe it was Chris he came out. Ahm, gave him a hand, with the measurements and that. And ahm, that's it, opened up the road after he was done. And then later on that day I attended to talk to(cu) to search the vehicle again. Ahm, the accused vehicle I believe. And ah, just took any of belongings out of there. His keys and stuff like that he would need and brought that back to the office and handed that over to the Sergeant, Norm CARTER at the time. That's basically about it.

KENNETT: Okay. Anything else?

GRAHAM: That's all I can think of at the time.

KENNETT: Okay. You can just put those down...

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: Okay.  
KENNETT: ...here if you need to refer to them. Ahm, just the sound picks up.(laughing)

GRAHAM: That's right.

KENNETT: Ahm, okay so who was driving?  
GRAHAM: Who was driving what?

KENNETT: On the way to the accident?  
GRAHAM: I was.

KENNETT: Okay. And which unit were you in?  
GRAHAM: Ahm, (pause) I believe it be Unit 4. Yes (cu) 4.

KENNETT: Alright. And you said that you had received a call. So...  
GRAHAM: Yes,

KENNETT: ...tell me about that. How did that all, like where were you, who  
GRAHAM: I was in the office. I just received the call. Ahm, that there was ah, an accident at 59 and the Perimeter. (pause) And ah, (pause) just a male saying there was an accident at the 59 and the Perimeter. And as we were coming, it was noticed the traffic was backing up and backing up. And by the time we got through we could see the, the three vehicles.

KENNETT: Okay. Did you get the name of the male that ah, gave you the phone call.  
GRAHAM: Later on he came back and said I am the, the male that phoned, so I tended to the Oil Refinery in East St. Paul that's where he works.

KENNETT: Uh hum.

GRAHAM: And ah, obtained a statement from him.  
KENNETT: Do you remember his name at all, er?  
GRAHAM: Look through notes here. (pause, paper shuffling) Actually there should be more notes that this.(paper shuffling, pause) No there should be more notes than this. Because I wrote my note (cu). What I intended to (cu)his name here.

KENNETT: Okay. We'll check all that out.

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**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Alright. So you were in the office...

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: ...and was it the start of your shift?

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Okay. So you would have started at what time?

GRAHAM: Seven.

KENNETT: Alright. And was it just ah, an overlap is that why ah, WOYCHUK, cause I understand WOYCHUK was on night shift.

GRAHAM: Yes. He wa..., well he was on nights and he works 'til 7. Day shift comes and takes over. And ah, Glen PEDERSEN ahm, I think we both worked a day shift that day.

KENNETT: Okay. Now for Chief to come along with you, was that a normal occurrence for him to come to the accident scene, or.

GRAHAM: Well, yes, since, since I was really the only one there at the time, didn't change and stuff like that. Usually a three vehicle accident at that time of the morning, you need more than just one or two people there...

KENNETT: Uh hum.

GRAHAM: ...so he, he always came along, that was just his job. I kind of just want him to come out as well.

KENNETT: Okay. But he would normally come in, come with someone, right, like he wouldn't take his own car, or.

GRAHAM: Well he would either come with someone or take his own car. Whatever, he would just hop in and goes. So if we need more vehicles there, if more members came in that day...

KENNETT: Yeah.

GRAHAM: how would they get there...

KENNETT: Yeah.

GRAHAM: ...you know, they need, they need their vehicles there.

KENNETT: Okay, so he just decided he come to help...

GRAHAM: Yeah,

KENNETT: ...is that kind of.

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Okay, ahm, now once you got up on the scene, ahm, maybe it might be easier to draw a diagram...

GRAHAM: Okay.

KENNETT: ....as to where exactly you parked and where everybody was.

GRAHAM: Sure.

KENNETT: And where the accident was. So if you can just ahm. There's a pen right here.

GRAHAM: Perfect. Thank you. (Cu) (laughing).

KENNETT: No problem, none of us are. That's why were doing this, right.

GRAHAM: Ahm. Okay. This will be south, 59, west, 101, okay. As we're driving south, we approached the intersection. As we got through all the cars and there was, I think it was vehicle number 1, it's right here in the snowbank.

KENNETT: Uh hum.

GRAHAM: Okay. The yellow Sprint I believe was facing this way. And the accused vehicle was in here.

KENNETT: Okay. And where did you pull up to?

GRAHAM: We first attended we pulled up to right about here. Cause there again was debris all over the place and ah, Winnipeg Fire Paramedics were in here.

KENNETT: So as you arrived then, was there actually ah, you said Winnipeg Fire Paramedics ah...

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: ...was there an actual ambulance there or was there a fire ah, truck there or do you recall what you saw when you first pulled up?

GRAHAM: I believe it was fire,

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: Yes, I believe it fire (talking over each other)

KENNETT: So it was a fire truck. Alright, ahm, or was one of their smaller vehicles? (talking over each other)

GRAHAM: One of their smaller rescue...

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: ...kind of like a first responder whatever...

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: Right.  
GRAHAM: (Cu)  
KENNETT: Okay. So at you didn't se..., at that time you just saw the red...

GRAHAM: Yes.  
KENNETT: Is it red?

GRAHAM: Yes. I believe it's red.

KENNETT: Okay. So you pulled up here and you said initially, then was there a time when you moved the car?  
GRAHAM: I pulled up ahm, we both got out. Chief BAKEMA and I both got out. Ahm, I saw traffic was still, trucks still trying get through to, so to preserve the scene...

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: ...I backed up to here where the train and then it goes on to the West Perimeter.

KENNETT: Okay. So is the scale somewhere in this vicinity?  
GRAHAM: This scale is the stack up in this area.

KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: Okay.

KENNETT: Okay, so from the time that you pulled up here to the time that you backed up your vehicle...  
GRAHAM: Uh hum  
KENNETT: ...here. How much time would have elapsed?  
GRAHAM: Was a matter of, maybe three minutes.  
KENNETT: Alright.  
GRAHAM: Okay. So then I pulled up here, I blocked traffic...

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: ...I was setting up cones. Ahm, Glenda PEDERSEN, she showed up. I told her to finish setting this up, ah, direct the traffic this way.

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: Okay. That time after she did that, starting doing that, I pulled up to here again and put my car across this way.

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: Okay.

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: I then got out, I attended, at that time the First Responder, East St. Paul First Responders attended and I believe they parked back here. Yeah, back in this area, I believe. And then they attended to the yellow Sprint.

KENNETT: Okay. So I am just gonna before this starts to get too confusing.  
This is Winnipeg, right?  
GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Then this one East St. Paul?  
GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: And ah, okay, that's ah...

GRAHAM: That's the accused.  
KENNETT: Ah, (pause)

GRAHAM: Victim  
KENNETT: (pause) And this one?

GRAHAM: And I guess just.  
KENNETT: What did color did you call it?  
GRAHAM: Ahm, it was a green Accent, I believe.

KENNETT: Okay, and so this is you...  
GRAHAM: Right.  
KENNETT: ...initially. And this is you sec., or well.  
GRAHAM: Se..., second, third (talking over each other)  
KENNETT: Second was over here.  
GRAHAM: Second was over here.

KENNETT: Okay. And then this is third.  
GRAHAM: Okay.

KENNETT: Alright. So you pulled up.  
GRAHAM: Yes.



**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: And you'd both got out of the vehicle.  
GRAHAM: Uh hum.

KENNETT: And where did you go, initially?  
GRAHAM: I came to here. Ahm, I don't know where Chief BAKEMA went. I came to these guys here, looked around and I saw vehicles were still trying to get by and sneak by.

KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: So to preserve the scene, I backed up and blocked traffic off.

KENNETT: Okay. Now did you at that point, who, who was running the, the file at the point? Like who was in charge of the scene?  
GRAHAM: (pause) I have, no, basically, ahm, what happened is we got out there. We tried to control the scene as much, good as we can. Until we get more members there. At that time ahm, I believe it was Chief BAKEMA called out Sergeant Norm CARTER.

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: To kind be ahm, (pause) be part of the scene, be control the scene, ahm, what to do. And stuff like this.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, were you there when he phoned him?  
GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: Okay. But how do you know that he did that?  
GRAHAM: Because there was up to ah, Norm CARTER to, I guess do report something. I don't know. That is just what's I was told that he called, that Chief BAKEMA called him, Norm CARTER to kind of ahm, take things over, make sure you know, you need more than one supervisor there basically. This is a serious incident.

KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: Ahm, that's basically all I was told.

KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: He's, he was just calling in so.

KENNETT: Okay. But as far you, you and Harry are the only Police here initially.  
GRAHAM: At the time, yeah, initially.

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: So which on of you was making decisions and calling the shots?  
GRAHAM: Well I guess when I was back here, Harry was ahm, called the shots I guess. I was back here blocking this off, he'd be the one over here seen what, who to go with first. What to deal with.

KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: You know. Who needs the most medical attention. As these guys were dealing with these.

KENNETT: Okay. So when you first pulled up then ahm, you went and spoke to the Winnipeg First Responders.  
GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: And did you go and speak to any of the victims of th..., say the...  
GRAHAM: No.  
KENNETT: ...green car or the pick-up truck.  
GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: So you didn't talk to them at all?  
GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: Did you see what they were doing when you first pulled up?  
GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: You didn't see them at all?  
GRAHAM: I, I didn't, I came here and they were all around this vehicle here.

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: (Cu) and ahm, I came this vehicle and notice she was, you know, severely injured. And I looked around and there was still vehicles trying to go through, so that time I just left everything I told them to go block this off, stop the traffic.

KENNETT: Okay. So you did speak to the accused...  
GRAHAM: No.  
KENNETT: ....or get close to him at all (talking over each other)  
GRAHAM: No, not at all.

KENNETT: Do you know where he was at that point?  
GRAHAM: I have no idea.

KENNETT: Okay. Do you know who the accused was in this matter?

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**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: At that time, no.

KENNETT: Okay. At what point did you know who it was?

GRAHAM: Near the end of the day.

KENNETT: Cause you didn't actually have any ah,...

GRAHAM: I didn't have...

KENNETT: ...visual of him or?

GRAHAM: I didn't have any visual, I saw him in the vehicle with Constable WOYCHUK.

KENNETT: Uh hum.

GRAHAM: But I, I never spoke to him.

KENNETT: Uh hum.

GRAHAM: I never, you know.

KENNETT: Did you recognize him when he was in WOYCHUK's vehicle?

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: No. Okay. So you, you pulled up you checked around. Now, did you, when you went back to the second position which was to control...

GRAHAM: Uh hum.

KENNETT: ...some of the traffic. Did you tell Harry where you going?

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. Now would that be just verbally?

GRAHAM: That's just verbally, yeah.

KENNETT: Right, cause your guys are...

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: ...standing close to each other.

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Hey, I'm going to go...

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: ...is that kind of how it went or?(talking over each other)

GRAHAM: Lead the idiots away from her.

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**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: (laughing)

KENNETT: So you had made that decision...  
GRAHAM: Right.  
KENNETT: ...that you were gonna go and, and stop this traffic because of the,  
it was to protect the scene.  
GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: Alright. And so what did Harry say, I'm do..., wa...  
GRAHAM: He just said, go ahead.

KENNETT: Okay. So he was going run the rest of...  
GRAHAM: I guess...  
KENNETT: the scene from here?  
GRAHAM: I guess.

KENNETT: Okay. So, do you recall from the time you arrived, do, do you  
remember what time it was exactly and wha..., secondly where do,  
did you get tho, those times from.  
GRAHAM: The time that I arrived?  
KENNETT: Uh hum, at the scene, like, do you recall where you might have got  
that time from. Did you record it right away or did you get  
it...(talking over each other)

GRAHAM: Well I just...  
KENNETT: ...from someone else later?  
GRAHAM: ...I looked on the, the dash.  
KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: The clock of the dash, the vehicle...  
KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: ...and I just try to keep that in my head, I be. You can't stop and  
start writing stuff down...  
KENNETT: Yeah.  
GRAHAM: ...you just keep as good a memory as you can.

KENNETT: Right.  
GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: So, that's what you did that day?  
GRAHAM: Yes.

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: Was there any other, like my understanding is there's ah, sometimes people use different ways of recalling the time or, ah, using dispatch perhaps to log the time for you or anything like that?  
GRAHAM: Some people do at times, but I remember looking at the dash.

KENNETT: Okay. What time was it?  
GRAHAM: I believe it was (pause) ahm, a couple minutes after, yeah it would be 7, about 7:16.

KENNETT: Okay, so this is an estimate roughly that you....  
GRAHAM: (Talking over each other) this is an estimate roughly. It, by the time we, you know, got in the vehicle, got to the sc..., got to the traffic...

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: ...got to the scene. You are looking at I don't know, 4, 6 minutes, something like that.

KENNETT: Okay. And was there confusion, confusion initially on where the accident scene was?  
GRAHAM: (Pause) ahm, not on my behalf, because the, the guy said 59 and the Perimeter.

KENNETT: Uh hum. Well my understanding is that ah, WOYCHUK and ah, PEDERSEN started heading out towards Henderson Highway.  
GRAHAM: Well, PEDERSEN s..., usually on her own half the time anyway. She is always lost and in directions, she's very hard dealing with directions.

KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: Ahm, and the congestion of traffic, I don't know. Ahm, maybe some people get confused. I don't but, I was told 59 and the Perimeter and that's where we went to.

KENNETT: Okay. But you don't recall ah, the other two officers arriving after you? Like quite a few minutes after you arrived.  
GRAHAM: WOYCHUK arrived quite a few minutes, cause he came out this way.

KENNETT: Okay. So your indicated he coming from the south.  
GRAHAM: From the south...  
KENNETT: (talking over each other) On highway 59

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: (cu)59, yes...

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: ...he was northbound on 59.

KENNETT: So well just ah, this is WOYCHUK?

GRAHAM: Yeah. And I believed he pulled up and parked somewhere in there, yeah. Yeah(cu)

KENNETT: Cause he's facing northbound.

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: This is WOYCHUK again.

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. And you said it was a few minutes after, quite a few minutes after.

GRAHAM: I don't know about 5, 8 minutes, I am not too sure.

KENNETT: Okay. So where were you when ahm, WOYCHUK pulled up? Where were you parked?

GRAHAM: I was parked right here.

KENNETT: Oh, so you'd already moved from this position over to here?(talking over each other)

GRAHAM: I had already moved, right. I think, I believe as I was moving here, he was pulling up.

KENNETT: Okay. And where was PEDERSEN? Where did she come from and when did she arrive?

GRAHAM: She, I don't know where she came from, or she finally, attended to me here. To block this off, so I can proceed back up.

KENNETT: Did you wait for her or did you move to this...(talking over each other)

GRAHAM: No, I waited for her.

KENNETT: ...second. You did wait for her.

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Did you actually speak to her at this point?

GRAHAM: I just told her just to block traffic here, and direct traffic to the westbound Perimeter.

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: Okay let me rephrase that. Did you speak to her in person or was it over the radio?

GRAHAM: It was over the radio.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: So you, you were talking to PEDERSEN over the radio.  
GRAHAM: Over the radio, yes.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: And then until she got here and that's when we left.

KENNETT: So, is it possible that sh..., as she pulling up, you're, you see that she's coming almost there so you move away or did you actually physically wait until she was actually right beside you. (talking over each other)

GRAHAM: No, I waited until she was right here. Until she pulled up.

KENNETT: Uh, huh.

GRAHAM: And as she pulled up, I left.

KENNETT: Okay. So you pulled, you as you pulling here is that when you saw WOYCHUK?

GRAHAM: That's when I saw WOYCHUK, in, right at the time or shortly after I saw WOYCHUK, sitting right there.

KENNETT: Okay. Now what did, what did you do when you got to this second position, like what was, what did you do then, cause now you know that PEDERSEN taking care of the traffic...

GRAHAM: Uh hum.

KENNETT: ...coming from the North. So now what, what's your role there.

GRAHAM: I, I got out of the vehicle here. I went to the scene and (pause) I think I attended to this vehicle here, that they were working on. And at that time they advised me, that there's no signs of life.

KENNETT: Uh huh. Okay.

GRAHAM: So then, (pause) ahm, I think I advised about speaking to Harry in this spot after that. And ahm, he told me that he called out Sergeant CARTER...

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: ...and that he spoke to this person here and put him in

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WOYCHUK's vehicle.(pause) And that ahm, he used to work, fo..., works Winnipeg or he used to for Harry or something or with Harry something like that. Cause Harry was a Sergeant in District 3...

KENNETT:

Right.

GRAHAM:

...for Winnipeg. And said that he used to work under Harry or something like that. I can't remember the exact words.

KENNETT:

Right.

GRAHAM:

But and then, ahm. (Pause) Then I believe I went to the vehicle and I opened it up and I could smell strong, cause I wanted to get the plate number and description of the vehicle for my notes.

KENNETT:

Uh huh.

GRAHAM:

And I opened up the vehicle, I smelled odor of alcohol in the vehicle. Ahm, I looked behind the seat and I saw the uniform sitting there.

KENNETT:

Uh huh. Okay. Just going to back you up again. So you (sigh) you said that as you pulled up here you, you think WOYCHUK was either here or just pulling up here?

GRAHAM:

Yes. Something like that.

KENNETT:

Somewhere in that and then you went over and you were watching the yellow vehicle or...

GRAHAM:

Yes...

KENNETT:

Dealing with whatever.

GRAHAM:

Yes, talking to ah...

KENNETT:

So ahm, through the, in that time that must of been when Harry ah, escorted the accused from this vehicle to WOYCHUK's.

GRAHAM:

Yes.

KENNETT:

Now did you see that?

GRAHAM:

No I did not, see it.

KENNETT:

You didn't see that.

GRAHAM:

I didn't see it.

KENNETT:

Huh.

GRAHAM:

I don't think I saw it. I don't remember, recall.

KENNETT:

Uh huh. Alright. Do see you recall seeing WOYCHUK get out of his police car at all and come and talk you guys, or?



GRAHAM: No, cause when the accused was in that vehicle WOYCHUK stayed in that vehicle the whole time.

KENNETT: How, how do you know that? Were you watching him the whole time, or?

GRAHAM: Well because he never came out of the vehicle. He never came in this area.

KENNETT: Okay. Well s..., but you couldn't say for sure...(talking over each other)that he stayed in his vehicle.

GRAHAM: I couldn't say for sure, well he might of I'm not, not sure, but the time what I saw, I never saw him step out of the vehicle.

KENNETT: Okay. So, okay. So your talking to Harry and as far as you know at this point, the accused was already in WOYCHUK's...

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: ...vehicle. Do you know approximately what time that might have been?

GRAHAM: I have no idea.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: I don't keep track of other people's times.

KENNETT: Well your time though.

GRAHAM: Well I keep track of my time, but...

KENNETT: (talking over each other)But beca..., you know the times that you've...

GRAHAM: I don't keep track of the time Harry talks to this person. The time Harry puts them in this vehicle.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: I don't do that.

KENNETT: Yeah. No and I am not asking you to keep track of anyone else's time I'm,...

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: ... but in your time, cause you know you've arrived and you've moved from this ah, first position to the second position.

GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: Then to the third position and then you get out, so roughly at that point...

GRAHAM: I have no idea.

KENNETT: Do you know, can you estimate how, how much time might of ahm, gone by's from the time that you arrived?

GRAHAM: No, I couldn't tell you.

KENNETT: Can't even estimate.

GRAHAM: No I can't.

KENNETT: Seriously.

GRAHAM: It was over a year ago. Can you ask me what you were...

KENNETT: Yeah, well I know...

GRAHAM: ...and the time?(talking over each other)(cu)

KENNETT: but you've got your notes and, and you can refer to them, so.

GRAHAM: (pause) No, I, I can't tell you.

KENNETT: Okay. So then at this point then, after you talk to Harry and you see the accused is in WOYCHUK's vehicle. Did, did ah, Harry tell you anything about the accused at that point as far as any concerns he had aside from being a Police Officer?

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: Ahm, did he mention to you about what might of cause the accident?

GRAHAM: He said he seem him dis..., distraught.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Ahm, other than he said he seem distraught and ah, he says that ah, he worked with him in District 3.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: And that was it.

KENNETT: Did he tell you that he may be impaired?

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: Nothing about alcohol or anything like that.

GRAHAM: Not that I can remember.

KENNETT: Okay. You'd remember that if he'd told you that though eh.

GRAHAM: I've, probably would, I might yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, and was did Harry tell you to go check on the vehicle

and search the vehicle or was that just something you did on your own, or..

GRAHAM: That was just, that was something I did, because I like to get the information of the vehicle...

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: ...of all the vehicles involved. And you know I usually look in the vehicle.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: You know. Maybe there's something in there, maybe the person was drinking. I don't know.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: You know. (Cu)

KENNETT: Okay. So you checked the car and you, you know secured the ahm, police uniform. Now, the reason for securing it was why?

GRAHAM: Well, co..., because if it is going to Dr. Hook...

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: ...they don't need to, Dr. Hook is know for takers things out of people's vehicle. And it's property of the City...

KENNETT: Uh huh

GRAHAM: ...of Winnipeg, that's why seized it.

KENNETT: So you wanted to secure it?

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: You were securing it. Make sure it didn't get stolen, or, right. Okay. Ahm, and then you did smell the liquor though at point, or.

GRAHAM: Right, right.

KENNETT: I mean did you see any liquor bottles in the vehicle...

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: Or, nothing like that(talking over each other)

GRAHAM: No, I could smell.

KENNETT: But you could just smell liquor, okay. Ahm, so did you go and tell Harry that?

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. So you let him know...

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: ...that there was liquor in the vehicle and.  
GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Now do you know if ah, if Harry went to tell WOYCHUK that or did you go tell WOYCHUK that information?

GRAHAM: I don't know, I didn't tell WOYCHUK that. (Cu)

KENNETT: But you just told Harry.

GRAHAM: I just told Harry, yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. And did Harry ahm, we..., did he have a portable that day, do you recall?

GRAHAM: I can't recall.

KENNETT: Cause you know how sometimes the Chief...

GRAHAM: (Cu)(talking over each other)

KENNETT: (Cu)exactly.

GRAHAM: I, I can't recall if Harry had (cu)

KENNETT: Okay. But that might explain if things weren't going over the radio very much, it might explain.

GRAHAM: Again I am not too sure what he had.

KENNETT: Okay. But you communicated to Harry personally.

GRAHAM: Personally. Yeah.

KENNETT: Alright. So you've checked this vehicle...

GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: ...now was it your responsibility to have this vehicle towed later on or, was that your duty or,

GRAHAM: Oh, we wait until the traffic analyst is all done with all of his measurements..

KENNETT: Uh huh

GRAHAM: ...and he advise us and he's done. And then we call Dr. Hook. And they come and we make sure that this tow properly to the right place.

KENNETT: Okay. Ah, and then you did an inventory you said.

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: La.., at, at a later point that day.

GRAHAM: Later point, yeah.

KENNETT: Right.

GRAHAM: I attended to Dr. Hook on Lawson and did inventory and took everything back to the office and handed it over to Sergeant CARTER.

KENNETT: Okay. Now as far as your notes. When, when did you do your notes then, cause I, I'm, I se, I think I recall you might of been at the scene all day.

GRAHAM: Yes. This, ahm, when it kind of quieted down.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Ahm, everyone was kind of gone. And at the time to kind of jotting things down.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: And then ahm, like time ahm, (sigh, long pause) yeah I guess when everything's done, quiet down, I went to each vehicle and wrote down the description of each vehicle in the notes. And ahm, what time the First Responders arrived, and what time the Winnipeg Fire Paramedic Service ahm, left the scene, and the time the daughter arrived and stuff like that.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Tha..it was quieted down and was ready under control.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: And there is really not much you can do, so as that time I started writing stuff down as it happens.

KENNETT: Okay. So you were actually sitting in the police car...

GRAHAM: No. I had my notes out walking around and writing down.(talking over each other)

KENNETT: ...doing your notes. Oh. Okay, cause it was pretty cold that day.

GRAHAM: Yeah, it was.

KENNETT: Yeah, cause they ah, it(talking over each other) It's tough to...

GRAHAM: (laughing) as you can see my writing not that neat.

KENNETT: It was tough that sometimes pens don't work very good in minus 20 weather, either.

GRAHAM: Well if yo...

KENNETT: it's tough to start.

GRAHAM: ...have a couple in your pockets (laughing)

KENNETT: Right. You actually started jotting these notes...  
GRAHAM: Yes.  
KENNETT: ...down at the scene.  
GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, so then after the scene then you went back to the office and...  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.  
KENNETT: ...and ah, you and Harry together, or did somebody else take him back or?  
GRAHAM: Ahm, (pause)  
KENNETT: Excuse my stomach.  
GRAHAM: Hum, ahm, I can't remember if we both attended. (pause) Yeah I think we both attended, cause we're, we had a vehicle there, I believe. And we were both taking turns, cause it's so cold we're going in and out of the vehicles taking turns directing traffic and that. I think, I'm pretty sure, I can't recall for sure, but I'm pretty sure that yeah, we both attended back together.

KENNETT: Alright. And a.., at that point, did ah, you and Harry go over times and stuff for the notes?  
GRAHAM: No, I think he was making his own notes. Cause he was doing.

KENNETT: I mean it's often that people would...  
GRAHAM: Often.(talking over each other)sometimes you get this, sometimes you would get that.  
KENNETT: ...say, you know what time did we get there and.  
GRAHAM: I can't, (pause) could be but I can't recall. (Pause) No I can't recall doing that.

KENNETT: Okay. Would it be normal though, I mean...  
GRAHAM: Well.  
KENNETT: ...let's face it your out at the scene, things are crazy(talking over each other)  
GRAHAM: It would be normal, to say what time, you know what time did we get there. But you both got there together and stuff like that.  
KENNETT: Right.  
GRAHAM: You know it might be. But I can't recall...  
KENNETT: Okay  
GRAHAM: ...communicating

KENNETT: And what time do you remember you, what time you were at the office 'til that night?

GRAHAM: Um. Like I said there's notes missing here. (Pause) Ahm, my shift was suppose to be over by 5, I believe. (Paper shuffling)I arrived back office , hum, probably 5.

KENNETT: Uh huh. Ahm, did you see WOYCHUK come in that night?

GRAHAM: ahm, I can...

KENNETT: To start his next shift?

GRAHAM: No, cause he'd be at night shift.

KENNETT: Right. And you might have still been there though at that time, do you know?

GRAHAM: No, I don't think I was.

KENNETT: Okay. Would it be ahm, possible if I said that you might of been there. What would you, what you think.

GRAHAM: If you can recall, refresh my memory. (Laughing) Could of been I don't know.

KENNETT: So.

GRAHAM: You'd have to refresh my memory on that, or, even if there is more notes, which there is more notes, because I recall writing that guy's name down.

KENNETT: Alright. Okay, and did you talk to any other witnesses at actual scene? Were you discussing anything as far as...

GRAHAM: Witnesses, no.

KENNETT: ... what happened or, do you know at what point did you find out that it was the accused. Liked how did you find out that it was the truck that caused the accident or, do you know where that information came from?

GRAHAM: Well I kind of came back, I think he came back, he said I am the one that called this in.

KENNETT: Hum?

GRAHAM: I think he, the person that actually called in the call...

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: ...I think he attended back to the scene and said I am the one that called this in and worked at the reprin...refinery. I was going to

work.  
KENNETT: Hum.  
GRAHAM: And that's.

KENNETT: So you think you might of spoken to him then...  
GRAHAM: Well I spoke to him.  
KENNETT: ...at the scene? At the scene though?  
GRAHAM: I'm pretty sure it was at the scene.

KENNETT: Okay. And did he stick around, or?  
GRAHAM: No. He was going to work. I said well, attend to your work and I'll get a statement from you later on.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: But I don't remember talking to anyone else at the scene.

KENNETT: Okay. If you heard his name would you remember?  
GRAHAM: Phiff. No.(laughing)

KENNETT: No. We'll, we'll try to find those ah, notes you say that there's some missing notes, right?  
GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Ahm, and I do have some other questions here, specifically, okay. So ah, just go through these. We got that. So I guess just upon your arrival at the scene and you have mentioned this already but, what was your observations initially as you were pulling up to the scene? What did you exactly see?  
GRAHAM: First of all, as we got through all the traffic, we pulled up. I saw the green, what was it again, the green vehicle on the side in the snowbank.  
KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: Okay. Right beside the light standard. I saw the yellow Sprint, severely damaged, in the middle of 59, facing east-west.  
KENNETT: Uh hum.  
GRAHAM: Then I saw the Dodge truck further up ahead in the ditch.

KENNETT: Okay. And what people did you at that point?  
GRAHAM: I saw the Winnipeg Fire Paramedic guys..  
KENNETT: Uh hum.



**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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- GRAHAM: ...and (pause) that's all I can remember. Those guys working, and cars trying to get through. That's all that I can remember at the time.
- KENNETT: Okay. Do you recall who you spoke to from the Winnipeg ah, First Responders?
- GRAHAM: No, I don't.
- KENNETT: Okay. Do you know, did you speak to ahm, ah, ahm, Fire Department ah, fellow, that may have been ahm, off duty at the time, but first on the scene? He would have been from Winnipeg ah, Fire Department.
- GRAHAM: Ahm, I don't, (pause) don't recall.
- KENNETT: Don't recall any one saying they were (talking over each other) first on the scene..
- GRAHAM: I recall someone saying that. They were on the scene and he's, he's an off duty Winnipeg Fire Paramedic.
- KENNETT: Okay. So...
- GRAHAM: But, I don't recall talking to him.
- KENNETT: But, I recall someone saying that.
- GRAHAM: I recall saying that, yes.
- KENNETT: Okay. Alright and you said that you didn't realize that ah, who the accused was until later in the day.
- GRAHAM: Right.
- KENNETT: Ahm, Harry didn't tell you who it was?
- GRAHAM: He told me later on.
- KENNETT: Oh, at this point when you were standing there.
- GRAHAM: At this point I was standing there...
- KENNETT: Okay.
- GRAHAM: That he worked with him.
- KENNETT: Okay.
- GRAHAM: Ahm...
- KENNETT: Did he tell you his name then at that point?
- GRAHAM: No.
- KENNETT: He didn't tell you the name?

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**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: No. He just told me he, he said he came to me and he used to work with, or something like that, I worked in District 3 or something like that.

KENNETT: Yeah.

GRAHAM: Can't remember exact phrase he said.

KENNETT: Alright.

GRAHAM: Ahm, Harry said that he doesn't, I remember Harry saying he doesn't remember him. Doesn't know who he is, doesn't remember who he was.

KENNETT: Uh huh. Did you know him at all?

GRAHAM: No I did., well I know his parents from Brandon.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Cause I'm originally from Brandon.

KENNETT: Oh, Okay.

GRAHAM: But at that time, I didn't know who he was.

KENNETT: Okay. But afterwards, you knew, (talking over each other)...

GRAHAM: Afterwards, yeah.

KENNETT: ...you found out, that like afterwards as in the next day...

GRAHAM: Yes. The next day.

KENNETT: ...or, later that day, or?

KENNETT: And what's his name then, the accused in this matter?

GRAHAM: Derek Harvey ZENK.

KENNETT: Okay. Harvey MORDEN-ZENK.

GRAHAM: MORDEN-ZENK, yes.

KENNETT: Ahm, so you didn't know him personally then, just?

GRAHAM: No, I did not.

KENNETT: You know his parents?

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: So you guys didn't go to school together...

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: ...or anything like that?

GRAHAM: No.

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KENNETT: Okay. And you and Harry at the scene, how you communicated with one another was...

GRAHAM: Verbally.

KENNETT: ...verbally. Not over the radio..

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: ...as far as you know. Did you have cell phones that you, did you each have a cell phone?

GRAHAM: We have cell phones, but we don't, don't work at a scene like this, why would we.

KENNETT: You never know, well cause you had moved to the second position was there any need for you to communicate to Harry?

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: No? Okay. (Pause) And as far as finding out who the driver was, y.., y.., as far as you know you, y.., y.., you're not sure where that information came from, or?

GRAHAM: I've, I've no idea where that came from. Ahm, I have no idea. I didn't know actually there, I didn't even know there actually someone in the vehicle until Harry told me.

KENNETT: You mean in the Police vehicle?

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: Okay. So did you have any interaction with ZENK? I'll call him ZENK, Ah, for short, ah, at the accident scene then?

GRAHAM: No, I did not.

KENNETT: No interaction whether directly or indirectly as far as even looking at him or anything like that?

GRAHAM: I s.., I just saw him sitting in the vehicle...

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: ...in the Police vehicle...

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: ...and WOYCHUK was in it. And that was it.

KENNETT: Okay, what vehicle was that?

GRAHAM: That was the Explorer. I believe that's what, (pause) (cu) which one it is

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: But it's the Explorer. That could be.(talking over each other)

KENNETT: I am too I believe, but that's, yeah.

KENNETT: Ahm, now did it ahm, was he in the back seat?  
GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Okay. And did you know if he was under arrest or anything like that at that time?  
GRAHAM: I did not know.

KENNETT: Okay. (pause) Okay. So what was your role at the scene then? If you were to put it, like what was your, your job when you were here at the, the scene?  
GRAHAM: Basically, just make sure everyone stays away from the scene, ahm, Fire, Paramedics can do whatever they have to do.

KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: Ahm, and at then at the time when the family arrived, the daughter arrived, that was, I guess, I kept her back. (Cu) all the information from her on Mom. Ahm, she called her father, and kind of kept them back away from everything that what was going on.

KENNETT: So you were dealing with...  
GRAHAM: Right.  
KENNETT: the family and traffic issues then.  
GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: Okay. So as far as dealing with the accused then it was Harry that was...  
GRAHAM: He was.  
KENNETT: ..dealing him...  
GRAHAM: Yeah.  
KENNETT: ...and, and, then WOYCHUK.  
GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. (pause) Would you be able to say then, who was in charge? Between you and Harry at the scene, like who is calling the shots, who is making the big decisions?  
GRAHAM: (Pause) I have no idea, like, that's how it works is, we, we get there, we do what we have to do.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: Such, we're such a small department, short manpower. You do what you got to do and then you figure out who is doing what later on, you know.

KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: Like we're experience where you go do something, if you see something that needs to be done.

KENNETT: Okay. Any...  
GRAHAM: So we...  
KENNETT: Go ahead.  
GRAHAM: There's really no one main person on the scene telling, directing people what to do.  
KENNETT: Aright. But something like this it would be ah, probably pretty common for you to be handling the file if you're the first investigator at the scene...  
GRAHAM: No,  
KENNETT: ...like you wouldn't?  
GRAHAM: ...not with East St. Paul.

KENNETT: Okay. Explain to me then you think Chief, the Chief would, would he normally run the file or would you? Like if you, if you and the Chief were here at the scene?  
GRAHAM: It's whoever the Chief directs to do.  
KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: I believe the Chief directed Norm CARTER to do it.

KENNETT: Okay. So at no point did you ever think that you were getting this file.  
GRAHAM: No point.

KENNETT: Okay. And to you that's, that's standard or that would be common.  
GRAHAM: That's East St. Paul. That's the way they deal with their things. That's how they work.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, so if you were at a scene, let's take away from this accident...  
GRAHAM: Okay.  
KENNETT: ...and you were there with some junior Constables, would you automatically expect to be the ah, running the file because you're the senior officer?  
GRAHAM: If they were the first people there, and it was if is small accident and they're the first people there, who knows. This place, East St. Paul, they, they wait 'til everything done and they say you do the

report.

KENNETT: Hum. And who would, you said the Chief makes that decision?  
GRAHAM: Or the Sergeant.

KENNETT: Uh huh. (Pause) Okay. So did ahm, as far as you know Constable PEDERSEN, did she ever attend the scene here?

GRAHAM: No she did not.

KENNETT: Or, was she.

GRAHAM: No, she was always back here.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: She never attended the scene.

KENNETT: And, but your not sure where she came from here.

GRAHAM: No s., she's coming south on 59 and then this is where she ended up. I told her stay here and direct traffic.

KENNETT: Okay. But prior to see..., seeing her come from the south, your not sure if she might of come from another direction?

GRAHAM: I have no idea where she came.

KENNETT: Okay. (Pause) So it was after you said you looked into the accused vehicle and it was after the accused was already in the WOYCHUK's vehicle..

GRAHAM: Correct.

KENNETT: ...is that right? Okay. And you said that you put the uniform in a bag, like exhibit bag or?

GRAHAM: (Pause) I can't remember if it, I think it was exhibit bag.

KENNETT: Cause I mean I imagine we don't really carry other kind of bags...

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: ...in the Police vehicle, right.

GRAHAM: Not in these vehicles, no.

KENNETT: So, ahm, and where did you put that then?

GRAHAM: I put that in my vehicle.

KENNETT: Okay. So, back, you walked back...

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: ...to your vehicle and put it in there.

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: (Pause) So at any point did you find it strange or, or ahm, that, the

GRAHAM: Chief was dealing with accused and not yourself?  
No. (Pause) Why would that be strange?

KENNETT: I'm just asking.  
GRAHAM: No I didn't find it strange at all.  
KENNETT: You didn't find it strange at all?  
GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: Ahm, is it common for Harry to be involved in acting files, like he would respond and...  
GRAHAM: That's what the municipality wants.  
KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: That's what the municipality wants...  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: ...is for the Chief to be, if it's short manpower, the Chief has to be out there doing stuff.

KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: That's what they are.

KENNETT: My understanding though that this was a, a overlap day. So you actually had more bodies on the schedule than normal.  
GRAHAM: Just for ahm, in the beginning of the day there was two members.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: WOYCHUK was finishing his shift, so if he wasn't hanging around just changing.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: He wouldn't of been there.

KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: You know.  
KENNETT: So there, but there was yourself, and there was PEDERSEN...  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.  
KENNETT: ...and, and ah, WOYCHUK, so that's three Constables.  
GRAHAM: But he, WOYCHUK was on his way leaving.

KENNETT: Okay. So two Constables.  
GRAHAM: Okay.  
KENNETT: And then ca..., you have the Chief, so there's three of you.  
GRAHAM: Right, right.  
KENNETT: And then ahm, I believe there was...

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: Mike(cu)  
KENNETT: ...day shift.  
GRAHAM: Mike, well there's a day shift, which was myself, and Constable PEDERSEN.  
KENNETT: Right.  
GRAHAM: There's a (cu)shift.  
KENNETT: Right.  
GRAHAM: Which was I believe Mike Karlchuk(ph) and he attended the traffic. I don't know what time he got there.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: Or anything like that so.  
  
KENNETT: Okay. Now he, I understand he relieved you at one point, so you guys could go the washroom...  
GRAHAM: Right.  
KENNETT: ...or something like that(laughing)...  
GRAHAM: Yes. Yes, very, yes.  
  
KENNETT: ...been a long morning already. Alright. Ahm, now did you have conversations with Mike at that time about what had happened or,  
GRAHAM: No, no just other than ahm, there's a death, ahm, and basically that was it. Ahm, at the time he came and relieved us ahm, this is already blocked off. Ahm, Paramedic was already gone, I moved up to here. And then ahm, and then Mike came relieved us. Ahm, we went to the office to do a thing, come back and he went to his spot.  
  
KENNETT: Okay. So y..., after talking to Harry here.  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.  
KENNETT: Right, and then you went and checked the vehicle.  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.  
KENNETT: And then, did you, what did you do at that point, after you went to the vehicle, you checked the vehicle, you took the uniform back to your car.  
GRAHAM: Took the uniform, went back to my car.  
KENNETT: And then, then what was your, you I guess were waiting for the ah...the analyst or,  
GRAHAM: Just waiting, wait for...ahm the analyst to come, and I was dealing with the family at the same time.  
  
KENNETT: Okay. So at what point then, you're dealing family first...



**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: ...I suppose, right.

GRAHAM: Yes, yes.

KENNETT: Is that the correct sequence? Ahm at what point then did WOYCHUK leave?

KENNETT: I have no idea.

KENNETT: Alright. Was he there when the analyst arrived, the collision analyst.

GRAHAM: No, I believe no, no.

KENNETT: So that helps with the time line...

GRAHAM: Yeah, yeah.

KENNETT: ...that he was already gone.

GRAHAM: Before the analyst arrived, yes.

KENNETT: Okay. And then what point then did you move your vehicle over?

GRAHAM: When the analyst arrived.

KENNETT: Alright. And up until that point, who was blocking traffic from turning this way?

GRAHAM: We had ah, ahm, Highways Department come out and they set barricades up.

KENNETT: Alright. And do you know what time they got out there?

GRAHAM: I have no idea what time they got out there.

KENNETT: Alright. Okay. Oh, my stomach is gurgling this morning. So at any point then you said you didn't have any direct or indirect ah, conversations or interactions with the accused, ZENK?

GRAHAM: None at all, none at all.

KENNETT: Did you observe him walking or?

GRAHAM: No, I did not.

KENNETT: Or anything like that?

GRAHAM: No, I did not.

KENNETT: Okay. Did Harry tell you anything about his ah, sobriety level or,  
GRAHAM: He just says he's really distraught and he said he worked District 3...

KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: ...when Harry was there and that was it. That is all that I know.

KENNETT: Okay. And then later on that day ahm, or evening, did you assist Harry with ah, times or anything with his notes?  
GRAHAM: Not that I can recall. Like he might ask the time when we got, the time we got there and the time we left but, no not that I can.

KENNETT: And how did you decide ahm, which vehicle was going to be number one, number two, number three. Like which...  
GRAHAM: That's just, that's just something that I do I just.

KENNETT: Okay. Cause that's just you have personal(talking over each other)  
GRAHAM: That's just my personal.  
KENNETT: thing that you did...  
GRAHAM: Right.  
KENNETT: ....you just decided which vehicle was going to be one, two, and three.  
GRAHAM: Right.  
KENNETT: Just to kind of keep track of it for yourself. Ahm, and in vehicle one, you've described the vehicle ...  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.  
KENNETT: ....and you've described the person that was in that vehicle. And same with vehicle two, but vehicle three you didn't describe anything. (Pause) Is there a reason for that?  
GRAHAM: No, I guess, I guess that's my, my mistake I don't know.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, as, go ahead.  
GRAHAM: I was talking to this lady here and she said ah, a ahm, wife of another Winnipeg member.

KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: Ahm, I can't recall the name, the last name but ahm, that is how I met her information.

KENNETT: Uh huh. So you're talking to her before she got into the ambulance.  
GRAHAM: Yes before, before she left.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, so you talked to her and obviously you couldn't talk to the...  
GRAHAM: Couldn't talk to her, that's what, yeah.

KENNETT: ....victim in the other vehicle. Okay. So, and, but you wouldn't have gone to the third vehicle and talked to them and get their information like you did on the others.

GRAHAM: Well when I went to this vehicle, this person is already in that one, in WOYCHUK's vehicle. So how can I talk to them?

KENNETT: Well that's what I'm trying get clarity on...

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: ...because you said initially though that you went and spoke to ahm, the victim in the green car.

GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: And that would have been right away before you'd gone to do the traffic.

GRAHAM: No, that was after I got back here.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: She was there for a while...

KENNETT: Cause she.

GRAHAM: ...she wasn't really injured that bad.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: She was there for...

KENNETT: But I know she'd did get ahm, escorted away for in an ambulance, so.

GRAHAM: Yes, she did.

KENNETT: So you talked to her before the ambulance....

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: ...was even attending to her though?

GRAHAM: No the ambulance guys were still attending to her.

KENNETT: Or was it the First Responders.

GRAHAM: First Responders, I mean yes, sorry First Responders were attending to her and then I was talking to her. She (cu)ahm, husbands, I think he's Inspector something with Winnipeg Police. And ahm, that was it.

KENNETT: Alright.

GRAHAM: But no, I, I did not get his name, I guess cause he was already in the vehicle with WOYCHUK.

KENNETT: Uh huh. Okay. Ahm, and then Harry actually ahm, wrote down the exact numbers as far as ah, one, two, and three of the vehicles same as you and that's why I'm asking if he, if you helped him with

his notes...

GRAHAM: Uh Huh.

KENNETT: ...cause it would be odd that someone would name them the exact same numbers and do it exactly the same.

GRAHAM: No, I did not, help him with that at all.

KENNETT: But you would've handed your notes into Harry, would you? Cause...(talking over each other)

GRAHAM: No it goes into the file.

KENNETT: ...it was at that time. Alright but at, at that point was not Harry's file initially and Norm was maybe, came into it after?

GRAHAM: Hum, I don't know who's file it was.

KENNETT: Okay. So who did you hand your notes into?

GRAHAM: It goes into the file and then I just...

KENNETT: Where was the file?

GRAHAM: The file, you handed your notes into ahm, you photocopy them and ahm, and if you have the file you put them in the file and it goes into read basket.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: And ahm.

KENNETT: What did you do in this specifically with this one though. Where would your notes have gone?

GRAHAM: I think they went to ahm, I would think I gave them to Norm.

KENNETT: Okay. So ahm, you don't recall sitting down with Harry, and I'm not saying that this isn't what normally would happen. Would you have sat down and said make sure you have the right details or, cause Harry might not have written it down, like you had written it down.

GRAHAM: To my recollection, no. I can't sa...

KENNETT: Okay. Now you didn't do an incident report on this file and I'm just wondering...

GRAHAM: An incident report?

KENNETT: ...like an inci., you know how the computer you have...

GRAHAM: I did a narrative.

KENNETT: ...an incident report, a narrative.

GRAHAM: I did a narrative.

KENNETT: Ahm, there was one with regards to returning ah, the vehicle and

- GRAHAM: ah, property and that sort of thing but there wasn't one as far as the actual incident. What you did when you got the scene and that sort of thing, I'm just wondering or your saying that you do one. I remember doing that. I can't, I don't if it was like a full narrative of everything I did, but that's what they always ask and I'm pretty sure.
- KENNETT: Well there isn't one in your name is what I'm telling you.
- GRAHAM: (Cu)
- KENNETT: There isn't one. Ahm, so if you did do one, maybe someone else adopted it as their narrative, I don't know.
- GRAHAM: Who knows. And that's, you know, like you say, there are notes missing here, who knows where they are.
- KENNETT: Uh huh. Okay, what pages ah, what time frame are we missing cause we'll check for that?
- GRAHAM: Not too sure, but it could the next day. (Pause) (shuffling papers) We got thirty-f., (pause) (shuffling papers) see if I can see the numbers on here. (Pause) here (shuffling papers) I'm trying to look at the numbers and you got 44 and 45 the numbers, the numbers change in the notes here. (Pause) Oh, but there, there's a time in there where I ahm, attended the oil refinery.
- KENNETT: Uh huh.
- GRAHAM: And ah, took a statement.
- KENNETT: And you would have had it in your notes?
- GRAHAM: I would have put in my notes that I attended to oil refinery and obtained a statement from so and so.
- KENNETT: And it was on the day of the accident or was it a different day?
- GRAHAM: I, I, I believe it was on the day of the accident.
- KENNETT: Okay. So that's the time that we're missing?
- GRAHAM: Yes.
- KENNETT: Does it make sense in there that there's pages missing or?
- GRAHAM: Ahm, yeah by, by these numbers here, yeah.
- KENNETT: What pages are missing?
- GRAHAM: Ahm, (cu) was 44, 45 and then it's hard to see what this one is. This looks like a (pause) ahm, (cu). Ah.

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: 121 looks like or 131.  
GRAHAM: 1 might be 121.  
KENNETT: Well it looks like 131 or 121, I'm not sure.  
GRAHAM: So, whatever in between there this, this last page here is 45.

KENNETT: Then what does the last, look at the last entry then here. 1600  
open intersection, clear scene.  
GRAHAM: That's when I cleared the scene.

KENNETT: Okay. So from 44 to 45 and then it's just blank. Okay.  
GRAHAM: So there's something missing.

KENNETT: Okay. We'll check on that. Ah, couple more questions. Ah, as far  
as using dispatch to log your times if you're at a scene, you know,  
cause you...  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.  
KENNETT: ...like you say, it's hard to write things down when you're out in  
the...  
GRAHAM: Yes.  
KENNETT: ...middle of the street doing other matters. Ahm, was that  
something common that people would do?  
GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Okay. Na, that for this accident in particular, ahm, is, did you do  
that?  
GRAHAM: I might have, I might have done for a couple times.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: But other than that, ahm, the time I arrived was my time, the time I  
got the call is my time and (shuffling papers, pause) everyone was  
leaving. (Pause) The time the daughter got there would be my  
times, because I was doing it as it was being done. Ahm, me when  
I called for Dr. Hook to attend, you call and you dispatch they call,  
probably that times might be the time I called (cu). But yes it, it's  
common for now, police we don't have a log.

KENNETT: Right. Okay but the..., just and just so I'm clear, the call that you,  
that came in initially though was like the back line or how come you  
guys were answering a complaint line at the office?  
GRAHAM: Because they want wos..., we have a dispatcher that was coming  
after hours, dispatch. When we're there, they want us to pick it up.  
KENNETT: Huh. Okay.

GRAHAM: You know, so we pick up the phones.

KENNETT: So, and how did they know when you're in the office, you let them know or?

GRAHAM: Yes. I mean they know our shifts, our day shifts starts at 7 that's when they're done. The dispatch(cu).

KENNETT: Okay, but what if you're out at an accident or on another matter. Out, out of the office then.

GRAHAM: Well, the municipality wants someone in the office at the time to answer the phones.

KENNETT: Okay, but you don't have support staff in the until 8 - 8:30?

GRAHAM: That's up, you got to, I don't know, that's up to municipality. I don't know how they work.

KENNETT: Alright. I'm just trying to figure out what, wa, how it was working on this day in particular. I'm not concerned about what..

GRAHAM: I, no, I pick up the phone answer it, got the call, went to it.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, as far as retrieving this information at a later point, as far as the times that dispatch might log for you.

GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: Ahm, how does that work, like what do you do, li..., how would walk me through how that would work getting those times from them afterward?

GRAHAM: You either call over the radio...

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: ...and they give it to you or, ahm, they pass on to you.

KENNETT: Okay. Do you recall in this for this incident what would have happened?

GRAHAM: They, they would have sent a fax.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: Ahm, of all the times cause, I think this should be with the file again.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Ahm, all the times that everyone attended.

KENNETT: Okay. So there, there would be a log...

GRAHAM: That's, that's. East St. Paul's log is what they fax over.

KENNETT: Okay. That's great. Okay, well give me a minute I'm going to try to find these other notes that you're...

GRAHAM: Okay.

KENNETT: ...saying. If you could just sign your diagram here.

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Anything else that, that ahm, has arisen as far as you want to provide clarity on or, anything like that.

GRAHAM: No, not that I can think of, off hand.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: Like I say it's no..., we're going on a year now.

KENNETT: Right.

GRAHAM: It's kind of hard to remember things that far back. I got a bad memory.(Talking over each other)(laughing)

KENNETT: That's why we take notes. Exactly.

GRAHAM: Why we take notes and some of them are missing still.

KENNETT: Yeah. Okay. Well, I'll leave these for you to look at if you want to refresh...

GRAHAM: Sure.

KENNETT: ...on anything and I'll come back in just a second here.

(door opens and closes) (long pause) (door opens and closes)

GRAHAM: Did you find anything?

KENNETT: No.

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: No. Ahm, but I will look for those, a, again.

GRAHAM: I will give ah, Norm a call, maybe he has them or something.

KENNETT: Yeah. Exactly. Ah, 11:03 hours I'm back in the room. Ahm, I would have thought we'd have it all, so...

GRAHAM: Missing some, yes.

KENNETT: ...I'll just, I would of think that disclosure, so I'll just make sure that hasn't been missed or something. Ahm, just a few questions to clarify everything...

GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: ...ahm, as far as you know was the accused think ever in any other police car aside from WOYCHUK's?

GRAHAM: No that I know of.



KENNETT: Okay. So he was never in the back of your police car?  
GRAHAM: Not that I know of.

KENNETT: Well is it possible he could have been in the back of your police car and you wouldn't have know it?  
GRAHAM: I guess it's possible, it's possible if I didn't know him. I, I've, I've, didn't se..., the only time I saw him, was in that vehicle. In WOYCHUK's vehicle.

KENNETT: Uh huh. Okay. (Pause) But you would never have had your, I mean, you weren't far from your police vehicle.

GRAHAM: That's right.

KENNETT: So, I would find it...

GRAHAM: It would be hard (talking over each other)hard to (cu)

KENNETT: ...hard to believe that you wouldn't, right, I would think.

GRAHAM: But no I, the only time I saw him was in WOYCHUK's vehicle.

KENNETT: Okay. Now did you see ahm, Harry go over to this vehicle more than a couple times, or, to talk to ZENK at all while he was in this police car?

GRAHAM: No not that I recall, no.

KENNETT: Did you see him go over there obviously, initially.

GRAHAM: He might have talked to WOYCHUK. I don't, I don't know, but ah, he was, I think he went there and he talked to WOYCHUK other than that. That's all I can remember.

KENNETT: Okay. And when you were busy, you said that you were dealing with the daughter....

GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: ...of the victim here, ahm, how long approximately were they at the scene for, do you know?

GRAHAM: Ahm, they were there for quite some time. Ahm, the daughter was there at 7:25. Ahm, the father arrived at 7:41 ahm, (pause) ahm, they were probably there for a good hour.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: An hour?

GRAHAM: A good, 45 minutes to an hour.

KENNETT: Okay. Well what time do you have that the ah, victim departed.  
GRAHAM: The daughter, the daughter was there at 7:25.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: Ahm, the father arrived at 7:41 and they probably didn't leave 'til probably quarter after 8 at least, 45 minutes at least.

KENNETT: You're saying the ambulances didn't leave 'til, 'til about 8:15 or so?  
GRAHAM: Oh they didn't leave exactly when they took the victim to Concordia.

KENNETT: Oh, okay.  
GRAHAM: They stayed there for a little bit. I talked to them, calmed them down. They waited for a driver to come, so they could drive them to the hospital. They didn't want them, like a family member...

KENNETT: Oh.  
GRAHAM: ...to drive them to the hospital. I didn't want them to drive, because they were so distraught and stuff.

KENNETT: How did they actually get to the scene then in one vehicle, like were they.  
GRAHAM: No the, the daughter saw Mom's vehicle. She came....  
KENNETT: Okay. So she drove herself.  
GRAHAM: And then, Right.  
KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: And then, she was on her way to the city or something like that and saw the vehicle.

KENNETT: Hum.  
GRAHAM: And then the daughter phoned the dad, and the dad came in another vehicle.

KENNETT: So you've got two vehicles?  
GRAHAM: So you've got two vehicles sitting there, okay. And then I called, I said you know is there someone else that can drive you there, because you shouldn't driving, stuff like this. So I think someone else came and picked them up and took them.

KENNETT: And they just left their cars there?  
GRAHAM: They left their cars there along the side, back, back further.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, well let's face it, that'd be a difficult job for you, right then and there...

GRAHAM: Yeah definitely.  
KENNETT: ...dealing with them, and was it you that was dealing with them that whole time or, did you get help from.  
GRAHAM: I dealt with them, no I dealt with them the whole time.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: I was dealing with, and then I also went to ahm, Concordia and I met them there, so they can, they wanted to view Mom and his wife.  
  
KENNETT: Oh, okay. But that was not, not at this...  
GRAHAM: Not, not during that time, no.(talking over each other)  
  
KENNETT: ...not during this time. Okay. Was that the next day or?  
GRAHAM: Ahm, that was later on that day, I believe.  
  
KENNETT: Later on the same day you think?  
GRAHAM: Yeah, I think, not too sure but, I'm, I think it, like I say I would be in my notes.  
  
KENNETT: Okay. So you were dealing with them the whole time.  
GRAHAM: The whole time.  
KENNETT: Like the whole time they were there, or?  
GRAHAM: (Cu) but me.  
KENNETT: Okay, but did it take up the whole, like you said you were there almost an hour?  
GRAHAM: Yeah.  
KENNETT: Did you, you were pretty...  
GRAHAM: Yeah.  
KENNETT: ...much tied to them?  
GRAHAM: Yeah. The daughter wanted to keep going to try to see Mom...  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: ...and I just wanted to stay there with her, cause she was the only one. I wanted to stay with her comfort her. Wait for her the father to arrive and.  
  
KENNETT: Okay, but once the father arrived and then, then were they, did you have to take care of them the whole time or were they just.  
GRAHAM: Yeah, I, no I they were in the car. I explained that you know, what happened, like when we arrived, what we saw stuff like that. And what's going to happen and the steps, what we got to go through.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Explained everything to them, just to get them relaxing.

KENNETT: Okay, so they were actually in the police car then...

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: ...you were talking to them.

GRAHAM: Talking to them, cause it was too cold to be standing outside, so.

KENNETT: Yeah. Okay. Now ahm, did Victims Services attend the, the scene here...

GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: ...or that was later on?

GRAHAM: No, that's later on.

KENNETT: So, did you a., actually ask anyone else then to take care of, like to deal with the family...

GRAHAM: not..

KENNETT: ...at the hospital, or?

GRAHAM: At the hospital?

KENNETT: Uh huh. Like once these, once the father and the daughter left the scene?

GRAHAM: Hum. (pause) I can't recall.

KENNETT: Okay. But you did, you dealt with the father and the daughter at the scene?

GRAHAM: Yes, yes.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, at that point when you first started talking to the family, I guess the daughter, first...

GRAHAM: The daughter.

KENNETT: ...you're dealing with the daughter, ahm, at that point was ZENK in the police vehicle already at that point?

GRAHAM: I believe so, yes.

KENNETT: Okay and what, sorry what time did you say the daughter arrived?

GRAHAM: The daughter arrived at 7:25.

KENNETT: At 7:25.

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: And you said at that point ah, ZENK was already in this vehicle.

GRAHAM: Yes.

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: Are you positive?  
GRAHAM: Not 100% positive, I'm, I'm pretty sure he was.  
KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: Because by that time everything kind of calmed down a little bit.  
Traffic was re-routed.  
KENNETT: Uh huh.  
GRAHAM: You know.

KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, so at that point then, you said 7:25...  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.  
KENNETT: ...she arrived. And you believe ZENK's already in the police  
vehicle.  
GRAHAM: I believe so yeah.

KENNETT: Ahm, Can you tell me at that point what other emergency vehicles  
were at the scene? (Coughing)  
GRAHAM: The, I believe the ambulance was still there. Ahm, (pause) I  
think the lady that was in this vehicle here, was already gone.  
Because the ambulance, the family was still here when the  
ambulance took the deceased to the hospital.  
KENNETT: Uh huh. Okay, so did you see when there was two ambulances at  
the scene?  
GRAHAM: Uh huh.

KENNETT: Okay. And you said that one had already departed.  
GRAHAM: One had departed with, with this victim.

KENNETT: Okay. And you think that was prior to the daughter ah, arriving at  
the scene.  
GRAHAM: That was basically, I believe at the same time.  
KENNETT: Oh.  
GRAHAM: Close to it.

KENNETT: Okay.  
GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Well do you recall if they saw the ambulance leaving and going "Oh  
is that my Mom in there?" or.  
GRAHAM: No, no they didn't.  
KENNETT: None, none of that?  
GRAHAM: It was, I think it was just, just leaving and as they were leaving, I

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turned around and she was running across the road. Yelling and screaming that, that's my Mom.

KENNETT: The daughter was.

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Okay, and you...

GRAHAM: I held back and took her back to the car.

KENNETT: Alright. Okay. (Pause) (giggling) Well here we go, no breaky. Okay and this may strange question, but, as far as RCMP Officers at the scene, ah, did you see any other RCMP Officers at the scene aside from the Collision Analyst?

GRAHAM: (Pause) Not that I can recall.

KENNETT: Okay. So it was East St. Paul, it was East St. Paul's area that had responded.

GRAHAM: They usually come to the area, but at that time, at this time here, initially, I, I can't recall I don't think so. Later on, I think a couple of did drive by, you know, stop, do you need a hand, you know?

KENNETT: But how much later, how long are you talking about?

GRAHAM: Oh, it was later on, after the ambulances were gone and Winnipeg Fire Para..., Fire Paramedics were gone. And I think we were just waiting for Analyst or something like that.

KENNETT: Okay. And can you tell me then the sequence of events as far as emergency vehicles departing the scene. You mentioned already that one ambulance had left, ahm.

GRAHAM: Yeah, the ambulance for this victim here, in the green car left. Ahm, bef., the East St. Paul guys were gone.

KENNETT: The East St. Paul guys, what do you mean?

GRAHAM: The First Responders...

KENNETT: Um.

GRAHAM: ... were departed before the ambulance with the deceased left. They left last.

KENNETT: Who left last?

GRAHAM: The ambulance with the deceased. (Talking over each other) They left last.

KENNETT: Okay. They left last. And as far as any other emergency vehicles

**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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- GRAHAM: left at the scene.  
There was, there's just basically ours and ahm, (pause) and that's basically it.
- KENNETT: Did you see ahm, Selkirk ambulance attend the scene?  
GRAHAM: (Pause) I can't recall it.
- KENNETT: Okay. Ahm, and did you see any of the, the ambulance ah, attendants obviously would tend to all the victims in the accident...  
GRAHAM: Ah, huh.  
KENNETT: ...and make sure that everyone is okay. Did you ah, see any of the ambulance attendants or ahm, Paramedics come to the police vehicle to see to tend to ah..  
GRAHAM: Yes.  
KENNETT: ... the victim or, or...  
GRAHAM: Yes. Yes on, on
- KENNETT: ...or the accused?  
GRAHAM: They came to I believe it was this side of the vehicle.
- KENNETT: Okay. So that's the east side of the vehicle.  
GRAHAM: Be the, be the passenger side of the vehicle they attended to.
- KENNETT: Alright.  
GRAHAM: I saw a couple there that's.
- KENNETT: Okay and when was that occurring in relation to...  
GRAHAM: That was after..  
KENNETT: ...what were you doing?  
GRAHAM: I was, I was here, dealing with the, the daughter.
- KENNETT: Okay. So your parked in the third position that you've...  
GRAHAM: Right.  
KENNETT: ...mentioned on this diagram. And you're dealing with the daughter...  
GRAHAM: Yes.  
KENNETT: ...at that time. Then you see the, you see the ah,  
GRAHAM: Ambulance, Paramedics were dealing with the accused in WOYCHUK's vehicle at that time.  
KENNETT: Okay. Was the, where was the ambulance that they were from? Like was there parked next to the police car or what?

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**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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GRAHAM: No, no they walked over. I remember them walking over.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: But I, I can't remember where they were parked.

KENNETT: Okay and do you know, ahm, did they talk to Harry, or ah, Jason or at that time?

GRAHAM: I have no idea.

KENNETT: You didn't see them.

GRAHAM: I have no idea, I was here dealing with the, the daughter.

KENNETT: Okay. So what you paid attention to was, you saw...

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: ...the Paramedics walking over and you saw them attend to the.

GRAHAM: I saw them standing there, around the vehicle. The door was open.

KENNETT: Around the police vehicle?

GRAHAM: Right.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: That's all.

KENNETT: And is it the rear door that your talking about?

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. So their over there. And that was when you were dealing with the daughter. Is that prior to the daughter's father arriving?

GRAHAM: Ahm, yes I believe so, yes.

KENNETT: Okay.

GRAHAM: I think I really at the time I got her to the car.

KENNETT: Uh huh.

GRAHAM: Yeah.

KENNETT: Okay. Was it a..., as far your concerned, was it fairly quick response by the emergency ah, vehicles at the scene. Like it was.

GRAHAM: It was very quick.

KENNETT: Okay. And the Winnipeg ah, First Responders you say.

GRAHAM: They, they were there first.



**STATEMENT OF: Ken GRAHAM**

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KENNETT: They were already there.  
GRAHAM: They were already there, yes.

KENNETT: Right. Okay. Now did their vehicle, does it look like an ambulance or it looks like ff..., I think we went over this, you said it was red.  
GRAHAM: It was red. It was one of the first Responder. (talking over each other, cu)

KENNETT: Okay. It belonging from, to the Fire Department...

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: ...not the ah,

GRAHAM: Yes, yes the Fire

KENNETT: ... Paramedics.

GRAHAM: Yes.

KENNETT: Okay. Anything else that ah, you'd like to ah, clarify or ah, add?  
GRAHAM: Not that I can think of at this time, no. No.

KENNETT: Okay. Would you say that this scene was a complicated scene?  
GRAHAM: No.

KENNETT: Pretty straight forward.  
GRAHAM: It's pretty straight forward, yeah.

KENNETT: I mean it's confined with one way traffic and that sort of thing.  
GRAHAM: It's pretty straight forward, ahm. We made there was no one getting through, there's no one walking in. We kept the media out of the area. Ahm, with our Department, with East St. Paul such a small Department, we're short manpower, you, you get there. You do as best as you can. You got to, you go and deal with ever you have to.  
Uh huh

KENNETT: One person goes one way and the other person goes the other way, deals with whoever until everything's under control and then, you know. Someone delegates who does what.

KENNETT: Okay. Alright. It's ah, n..., anything else. 11:15 concluding interview. Thank you.
